FRIDAY, JULY 15

9:00 a.m. 4-H Horse Show (Pleasure & Performance) - Horse Arena

SATURDAY, JULY 16

8:00 a.m. 4-H/FFA/Open Swine Show - Swine Barn

Members of the 4-H Swine project are the first to proudly exhibit their swine competing in market, breeding and showmanship classes. Once the 4-H'ers are done, exhibitors in FFA and OPEN CLASS compete in their respective divisions.

9:00 a.m. 4-H Horse Show (Gaming Events) - Horse Arena

4-H Horse project members show off what they have been practicing all year long by competing in games while riding their horse. Gaming events include barrels, jumping, figure eight, pole weaving and keyhole racing.

9:30-11:30 a.m. and 5:30-7:00 p.m. 4-H Demonstrations - 4-H Building

Members share their know-how on a variety of topics. The show and tell demonstration explains why each step is essential to complete a task. Some 4-H members choose to deliver a speech, teaching the listeners about a particular subject.

10:00 a.m. 4-H Sheep Show - Round Up Arena

Members exhibit their sheep in a variety of classes, demonstrating their skill and knowledge the entire time. The Lamb Lead class is where members combine their skills and knowledge of sheep production with the clothing and fashion project.

10:00 a.m. 4-H Dog Showmanship/Obedience - 4-H Building

This county dog show is the culmination of a year's worth of work where 4-H members train their dogs to obey commands, such as heeling and retrieving objects over jumps. Showmanship allows members to learn about breeds of dogs and general grooming responsibilities.

12:30 p.m. 4-H Beef Show - Round Up Building

Members in the Beef project exhibit their animals and demonstrate their skills when getting ready for the fair. The classes consist of breeding, market and showmanship divisions.

2:00 p.m. 4-H Fashion Show - Band Shelter

Members enrolled in the Clothing project showing off their sewing ability by modeling garments they have created. Clothes You Buy project members parade in outfits they have wisely purchased utilizing savvy buying skills. A Trashion fashion show concludes the style show. Come see wearable accessories and other fashion items created from recycled, repurposed and reused found materials.

3:30 p.m. Round Robin Showmanship - Round Up Arena

Judges critique the grand and reserve champion winners in the 4-H Beef, Dairy, Swine and Sheep classes as they take turns showing the different species. The 4-H'ers are quizzed about their knowledge and ability to handle the animals in each round. The winner receives the Mike Halverson award, a traveling trophy and belt buckle.

SUNDAY, JULY 18

9:00 a.m. 4-H Horse Fun Show - Horse Arena

With competition out of the way, the Fun Show gives Horse project members time to enjoy riding on their animals.

3:00 p.m. 4-H Awards Ceremony, Followed by Ice Cream Social - Band Shelter

4-H members receiving grand and reserve grand champions in each project area are presented with rosette ribbons acknowledging their achievement.

5:30 p.m. 4-H Livestock Market Auction - Round Up Arena

The Livestock Market Auction is a way for businesses, community organizations and individuals to support 4-H by bidding on blue ribbon livestock that were exhibited at the fair. This is a premium only auction.

4-H Market Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goats, Rabbits, Poultry and Dairy Steers are eligible for the 4-H Premium Market Livestock Auction. Rabbits must be checked in between 1:00 – 2:30 p.m. on Entry Day.

4-H Market Beef, Sheep and Swine must be weighed on Entry Day at 7:00 p.m.

A 4-H Premium Auction Consignment Slip will be completed at weigh-in time and must be turned into the 4-H Office at the Fair no later than 9:00 p.m. on Entry Day. Exhibitors who fail to turn in the Premium Auction Consignment Slip will not be allowed to sell their animal(s) in the auction on Sunday, July 17.

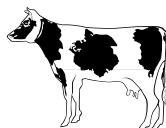

EVENT REGULATIONS

1. Advance entry fee is \$75 per event, per car, payable to the SABIN LIONS. Day of the event entry fee is \$100 (cash only) at the gate. Entry fee allows entry of one car, one driver and one pit person.

2. Additional pit personnel will be required to sign a liability waiver and purchase an armband for \$10 each for admittance to the pit area. Pit personnel under the age of 18 needs to have liability waiver signed by a parent/legal guardian.

3. Events are open to licensed male or female drivers. Drivers under 18 years of age are required to have their entry form signed by a parent/legal guardian **and** a notary.

4. One car per driver, one driver per car. Car numbers may be reserved by submitting early entries, but are not guaranteed until the entry fee is received. Pre-registered drivers will be featured in the event program. One more reason to get your entry in early.

5. One pickup/tow vehicle and trailer per demo car will be allowed in the pit area.

6. Entry/exit to pits will be the fairgrounds south gate only.

7. **Any pit crew utilizing a cutting torch will be required to have a charged fire extinguisher on hand at all times.**

8. Drivers are required to wear a DOT, or equivalent, certified helmet (full face preferred) and eye protection for the duration of their heat. Flameproof driving suits and gloves are suggested with a minimum of long sleeved shirts and long pants required. No open toed shoes or sandals will be allowed in the pit area.

9. **No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the fairgrounds. Any driver judged inebriated will be disqualified.**

10. Unsportsmanlike conduct of the driver, their pit crew or friends, may disqualify the driver from the event.

11. All cars will be inspected immediately after entry to the fairgrounds and impounded following inspection. Heat assignments will be drawn at this time. No further work will be done on the cars until after their heat. Bring them ready to run. Any rule violations are subject to disqualification and forfeit of entry/gate fees.

12. All drivers and pit crew members will attend the driver's meeting prior to the start of the event.

13. Drivers will not exceed 5 mph while in the pits or entering/exiting the arena.

14. Drivers are required to make aggressive contact with an opponent every 60 seconds. If a driver fails to do so, the heat will be stopped and the driver will be awarded a PINK FLAG on their car signaling they are sandbagging. If the heat has to be stopped again for the same driver, they will be disqualified.

15. If your car stalls, you will be allowed two minutes from your last initiated contact to get it started and initiate contact with an active opponent's car. Hitting a disabled car does not count as contact. If you do not initiate aggressive contact within the time allotted, your stick will be broken.

16. If a car is disabled, the driver must remain in the car until the heat is over. The driver will keep all safety gear on, including seat belt, helmet and eye protection.

17. **No hits in the driver's door. Violators are subject to disqualification!**

18. Car fires will stop the heat. In the event of a car fire, the arena judge will determine if it is safe for the car to resume. The driver may be allowed one chance to resume the heat at the discretion of the arena judge.

19. There will be no outside assistance or push-offs once the heat has started. If you get hung up on a barrier and are not able to get off within the allotted two minutes, your stick will be broken. **NO HITTING CARS ALREADY HUNG UP ON THE BARRIERS!**

20. The Clay County Fair/Sabin Lions Demolition Derby is a family event. Profanity on cars and profane gestures in the event arena will not be tolerated and will warrant an immediate disqualification!

21. All cars must be removed from the fairgrounds the evening of the event.

22. All decisions of the event/arena judge will be final. The Sabin Lions Demolition Derby Committee reserves the right to amend or modify these regulations at any time prior to or at the time of the event.
